SUSTAINABILITY COMMITMENTS: Intro to NDPE

No Deforestation, No Peat and No Exploitation



NPDE is a commitment to sustainability made by companies, primarily in the palm oil sector, to halt and reverse deforestation to develop land, development on peat land or the exploitation of workers, local communities and small holder producers.







The palm oil sector has made a lot of progress in recent years. Companies started with voluntary standards as a way to certify volumes and communicate this to stakeholders and consumers.

We need to get to 100% of palm oil being produced responsibly, from about 20% of global production currently RSPO certified.

IRF is a complement to Independent Verification of performance, not an alternative.


SUSTAINABILITY COMMITMENTS

Companies and NGOs in the palm oil sector have focused on addressing the most urgent sustainability issues, which has driven the adoption of NDPE commitments to create transformational change in the palm oil supply chain.

UNDERSTANDING



What is the IRF?

A single, shared, consistent reporting framework allowing individual companies and the industry collectively to:

- Understand what is required to deliver NDPE commitments
- Monitor and report on volumes at different stages of progress
- Identify areas that are not delivering
- Drive improvement





UNDERSTANDING & REPORTING



How IRF Works


- Refineries fill out templates on mill-level progress for the mills they buy from
- 2. A profile is automatically created on volumes in each category
- 3. The profiles are shared with customers who aggregate profiles from each of their T1 suppliers



UNDERSTANDING: How IRF Works




1 Template questionnaire



Actions a mill or company can take

- Self-assessment completed
- 100% certified
- Deforestation monitoring on own concessions
- Part of group with commitments and plan
- Traceable, but no known action



Aggregated profiles are shared

DOWNSTREAM



UNDERSTANDING: 5 Categories of Volumes



KNOWN ORIGIN

Self-assessment completed.
Traceable volumes, but no known action.

AWARENESS

Part of a group that has a commitment and action plan.
Awareness driven by workshop, site visit or self-assessment.
Grievances present or insufficient action taken.

COMMITMENT & STARTING ACTION

Developed and implementing own action plan.
Grievances are logged and action has begun.
Volumes certified by MSPO, ISPO or ISCC.

PROGRESSING

Deforestation
monitoring on own
concessions.
Grievances under
active resolution
process.
RSPO MB certified.
Timebound action
plan for
implementing
commitments.

DELIVERING

Volumes meet all requirements as 100% certified.
No active grievances.
Own operations and 3rd party are delivering on NDPE commitments.


Identifying Interventions

IRF provides buyers with a consolidated view of how much of their volume is meeting NDPE commitments in full, and equally importantly, what is happening in the remaining volumes.

The IRF is a universal language that all players can use and understand, to track progress, as well as identify where action is needed to implement NDPE in full.

Benefits of IRF

- Demonstrates the progress the industry has made
- Recognises all progress in production base - from early to advanced interventions
- Supports industry collaboration and willingness to work together to address issues








Ultimately companies / refineries will be entitled to produce four IRF profiles:

- No Deforestation
- No Planting on Peat
- Land Rights
- Labour Rights

If we don't know what is happening, it is not possible to plan effectively for further action to address gaps, nor to confirm that commitments are being implemented.

Building trust & transparency


The IRF is an aid to industry collaboration and willingness to work together to address issues.

PRODUCTION BASE: Where No Deforestation, No Peat, No Exploitation commitments apply

Benefits Throughout Supply Chain

- Visibility of progress beyond certified volumes
- Tracks activities: for environmental & social issues
- Common language to communicate with suppliers
- Single view vs tracking issues separately
- Aggregated profile that shows progress
- Can be used by smaller buyers to get same visibility and opportunity

- Uniform way to engage with mills
- Uniform view of data for consistency in buying decisions
- Shows commitment and supports engagement with mid and upstream






